Registration

Any such student who is not registered with the respective University shall have to get himself/herself registered with that University on payment of the requisite fee as decided by the University. The students who are not registered under University shall not be allowed to appear in the examination.

Examination

- To be permitted to appear in the examination for the Degree of the Bachelor of 4.1 Education (B.Ed.) a candidate must have:
 - Completed the courses of study prescribed for the B.Ed. Programme. Registered with Driversity as a student.

- Completed 80% attendance in theory classes and 90% in school (1111) internship and practicum of the total classes held.
- Completed the course in a maximum of three years from the date of (iv) admission to the programme.
- 4.2 A candidate for Bachelor of Education degree shall be examined in sixteen papers carrying total of 1300 marks.
 - There shall be five core courses carrying 100 marks each (80 marks for Theory & 20 marks for Internal assessment)
 - There shall be four core courses and two pedagogy of school subject carrying 50 marks (40marks for theory and 10marks for Internal assessment) each.
 - There shall be four Enhancing Professional Capacity (EPC) papers (0) carrying 50marks each, which shall be evaluated internally.
 - There shall be one optional course to be offered in areas such as (4) Vocational/Work Education, Health and Physical Education, Peace Education, Guidance and Counseling or an additional pedagogy course carrying 50 marks (40 marks for Theory &10 marks for Internal assessment).
 - There shall be School Internship programme for 250 marks in 2rd Year. The marks shall be awarded on the basis of overall performance of the student-teachers in the school during Internship programme. The institution shall maintain cumulative record of activities of each studentteacher during Internship programme for the assessment of overall performance.
- The written examination in each of the theoretical core papers, pedagogy of 4.3 School subject &optional papers shall be of three hours duration.
- For the evaluation of School Internship programuse, there shall be provision of 4.4 one external examination to be conducted by the University after completion of School Internship programme in 2nd year.
- Courses of study for Bachelor of Education examination shall be the same as 4.5 prescribed/approved by the Academic Council of respective University.

- 4.6 A candidate who, having completed the course, fails to appear at the examination or fails to pass the examination, shall be allowed to take subsequent examination on payment of prescribed examination fee without being required to repeat the course again. However, this opportunity shall be given only in one more examination, within a period not exceeding three years from the date of admission.
- 4.7 A candidate shall be allowed to appear in the final examination of Bachelor of Education course only if he/she clears the 1st Year examination. If he/she fails to clear the 1st Year examination within the stipulated period of three years from the date of admission he/she will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.

Conduct of Examination and Moderation of Results

- 5.1 The examination shall be conducted by respective University. The University shall finalize the programme for the examination and will charge the approved examination fee to conduct the examination.
- 5.2 In order to pass Bachelor of Education examination a candidate shall have to obtain at least 45% marks in each theory paper and 50% marks in each practicum paper separately. A candidate not securing the above qualifying marks shall be declared as fail.
- 5.3 The name of successful candidates shall be arranged in order of ment as follows:

- 5.4 If any student fails in not more than in tow theory papers, he/she will be promoted to 2^{ret} year course. But, he/she will have to clear all the backlog papers before he/she is permitted to appear in the final examination.
- 5.5 All student-teachers are required to go for School Internship programme for four weeks in first year and sixteen weeks in second year to different schools for practical exposure. The weightage of internal assessment for engagement with the field shall be 100 percent.

Award of Degree

Those who complete the programme poccessfully shall be awarded Bachelor of in prescribed format specifying the Class/Division/Grade in which he/she was placed.

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ORDINANCE FOR ADMISSION

1. Admission and Selection Procedure

- 1.1 The selection of candidates for admission to the Bachelor of Education programme (B.Ed.) in Regular mode shall be made on the basis of merit obtained in B.Ed. Entrance Test conducted by the respective University on charge of approved Entrance Test fee of Rs. 1000/-
- 1.2 The Entrance Test fee may be revised by the competent authority as and when required.
- 1.3 Admission shall be made strictly in order of merit i.e. percentage of marks secured by the candidate at the B.Ed. Entrance Test held for the purpose.
- 1.4 Reservation of seats for the candidates of reserved categories shall be as per State Government's rules.
- 1.5 There of 3% seats will be reserved for Person With Disability (PWD) candidates i.e. Visually Impaired (1%), Hearing Impaired (1%) & Orthopedically Handicapped (1%). These 3% seats are within the intake limit. Percentage of disability will be taken into consideration at the time of selection. The 3% seats of PWD candidates shall be filled up within the seat limit fixed for that particular category to which the PWD candidates belong to.
- 1.6 Appearance in the Entrance Test is mandatory. The reserved category candidates shall have to submit a copy of the certificate mentioning that the candidate belongs to a particular reserved category from an officer not below the rank of S.D.M.
- 1.7 Joint B.Ed. Entrance Test will be conducted centrally by the University. Date of B.Ed. Entrance Test will be announced by the University and merit list will also be prepared by the University after evaluation of answer books.
 - Admission-merit list shall be prepared by the respective University; and seat allotment will be done through Counseling.
 - 1.8 List of admitted students must be submitted to the University within one month after declaration of merit list.
 - 1.9 Reservation of scats provided in the general ordinance for admission shall be applicable only when candidate fulfills the minimum requirements of clause-1.3.
 - 1.10 After providing the opportunity for admission to the candidates having descending orders of merit of lower qualification up to the marks fixed by the respective University, if the reservation percentage of any reserved category is not filled up shall be exchanged as per State Govt. rules.
 - 1.11 If at any time it is found that candidate has furnished any false information, bis/her candidature shall be cancelled immediately and the deposited fee shall be forfeited and suitable legal action may be increated.

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- 1.12 In case of any controversy or irregularity pertaining to 2 year B.Ed. Course, the respective University shall take the final decision as per approved Ordinance and Regulations.
 - 1.13 No such applicant shall be admitted, who in the opinion of Vice-Chancelior, does not deserve to be admitted in the best interest of the University, (specifying the ground for rejection).

2. Eligibility

- 2.1 The candidate with at least 50% marks either in the Bachelor's Degree and for in the Master's Degree in Science/ Social Science/ Humanity/ Commerce, Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other qualification/examination recognized by the Academic Council of respective University equivalent there to be eligible for admission to the programme.
- 2.2 No such applicant shall be admitted, who has not applied for the admission within notified time or who, on being selected for admission, does not get himself/herself admitted within specified time, except where the delay has been condoned by the Competent authority for some valid reason.

Intake

There shall be basic unit of 50 students, with a maximum of two units. This intake capacity may be modified as per norms and guidelines prescribed by NCTE time-to-time.

Regulations and Ordinance for Admission to Bachelor in Library & Information Science (B.LIS) under Magadh University, Bodh-Gaya.

REGULATION

I. Duration of Course

The duration of course (B.LIS programme) shall be of Two academic sessions of 9 months each.

2. Course Curriculum

Candidate for the Bachelor's Degree in Library and Information Science shall be examined in eight papers carrying 100 marks each, divided into two Modules of four papers each. Examination of Module-I shall be conducted at the end of the first session and examination of Module-2 shall be conducted at the end of the 2nd academic session. There shall be five theoretical papers (written examination) two practical papers and one project work with viva-voce examination. The duration of written examination shall be of three hours each.

- I Library and Society
- II Library Management
- III Physical Bibliography and Book Selection
- IV Information Science and Reference Service

Module - 1]

- V Library Classification
- VI Library Cataloguing Practice
- VII Classification Practical Paper
- VIII Cataloguing Practical Paper

3. Delivery System

The methodology of instruction in this programme shall be different from that of conventional courses. It will be more learner-oriented and the student would be an active participant in the teaching-learning process. Most of the instruction will be imparted through distance rather than face-to-face communication. The University will follow a multimedia approach for instruction, it comprises:

I. Printed Materials II. Audio-Visual Aids III. Counseling Session IV. Practical Training

A variety of instruction methods of integrated learning approach will include lecture-cum-discussion, counseling session and practical classes as per the requirement.

A mix of methods varies depending upon the nature of the course. Guest lectures shall be arranged by inviting experts from the reputed academic institutions.

4. Attendance Policy

Attendance will be required as per the existing provisions prescribed by the Distance Education Council of India.

5. Practical Training

All students are required to go for practical training to different renowned libraries for practical exposures.

6. Medium of Instruction and Examination

- The medium of examination for the course shall be English/Hindi/Urdu.
- The final examination leading to the award of the degree shall be held at (11) the end of the two academic session from the date notified by the University.
- The mode of instruction shall comprise printed lessons in English, holding (III)contact classes, evaluating response-sheets and using other audio-visual aids available.
- Courses of study for Bachelor in Library & Information Science examination shall be the same as prescribed by the Academic Council of (IV)the Magadh University.

7. Registration

Every student who is not already registered with Magadh University will have to get himself registered on payment of the requisite fee. The students, who are not registered under Magadh University, shall not appear at the examination.

8. Conduct of Examination

- To be admitted to the examination for the Degree of Bachelor in Library & Information Science, a candidate must have:
 - (a) Completed the courses of study through Distance Education Mode in this University prescribed for B.LIS Examination.
 - (b) Registered with the University as a student.
- Each of the papers shall carry 100 marks. The distribution of marks shall be as 11. follows:
 - (a) Written examination carrying 80 marks; and
 - (b) Internal evaluation carrying 20 marks.
- The examination in each of the theory papers (written examination) shall be of VIII. Three hours duration.
- IV. ... The students are required to appear at the University examination at the end of each academic session from the date notified by the University.
 - V. w They have to appear at the assessment examination in each academic session, carrying 20 marks in each subject. Assessment marks are awarded on the basis of overall performance.
 - VI. The students have to submit a project report before filling examination forms at the end of the session. The project works shall be supervised by the teachers of the

department. The works based on field studies and site visits are undertaken by the students as per decision of the departmental council.

- They have also to appear at the Practical examination of 200 marks (Paper-VII & VIII) besides project evaluation/viva voce examination of 100 marks(Paper-IX). The Practical and viva-voce examination shall be conducted by the external and internal examiners appointed by the University.
- A Candidate having completed the course has to appear at the written VIII. (a) examinations, internal assessment, project-viva and Practical examination separately.
 - A candidate having completed the course to appear at the examination or fails to pass the examination or does not clear any paper shall be allowed to appear at the subsequent examination in only that/those part/s and which he/she has failed or absented himself/herself on the payment of prescribed examination fee without being required to go through the course again. However, This opportunity shall be given in only two more examinations within a period not exceeding three years excluding the main examination held at the end of session.
 - There shall be provision of carry over the examination. The result of the final examination shall not be published till he/she appears and passes in the paper or has not completed for some reasons.
 - IX. The examination shall be conducted by the Magadh University which shall also finalise the date of examination, centre of examination and necessary fee for its conduct.
- In order to pass the Bachelor in Library & Information Science Examination, a Χ. candidate must obtain not less than 45 per cent marks in aggregate, otherwise the candidate shall be deemed to have failed.
- In order to pass B.LIS final examination, a candidate must have passed B.LIS XI. Module-1 and Module-2 examination separately.
- The name of successful candidates shall be arranged in order of merit as follows: XII.
 - (a) Candidate, who passes B.LIS Examination obtaining 75 per cent or more marks in any subject in all the six parts of the examination taken together, shall be declared to have passed with distinction in the subject.
 - (b) Candidate who obtained 60 per cent marks in aggregate or more shall be placed in First Class.
 - (c) Candidate who obtains 45 per cent or more but less than 60 per cent marks in aggregate shall be placed in the Second Class.

9. Moderation of Results

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Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulation concerning moderation of examination results:

- The candidate for the B.LIS Final examination fail to secure first or second i) class by not more than 5 marks in the subject shall be awarded the marks required to enable him to secure first or second class as the case say be, and his result shall be declared accordingly.
- It a candidate for the B.LIS Final examination passes in aggregate but fails to pass in any one subjects by not more than 5 per cent marks or in any two ii) subjects by not more than 3 per cent marks in each subject, he/ she shall b

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ORDINANCE FOR ADMISSION

1. Eligibility for Admission and Selection Procedure

- v) The University shall hold Entrance Test for selection of the candidates. The Test shall be conducted in accordance with certain procedures:
 - (a) Application forms for Entrance Test shall be obtained at the office counter by depositing Rs. 500/- only through Demand Draft or may be obtained by sending a self-stamped registered envelope along with DD of Rs. 500/-.
 - (b) Applications received shall be processed according to the requisite qualifications and conditions.
 - (c) Final selection for admission shall be made strictly on the basis of Entrance Test.
 - (d) The University reserves the right to take any decision in all matters of admission.

2. Reservation

Reservation of seats for admission shall be in accordance with the State Government's rules/Magadh University rules. In no case, the percentage of reservation fixed by the State Govt. will exceed. Twenty five percent (25%) of seats shall be reserved for female candidate in each category.

MASTER OF ARTS IN EDUCATION (M.A. in Edu.)

Distance Learning Mode (Self-Finance Scheme)

Duration of Course

The duration of M.A. in Education under distance learning mode shall cover a period of two academic years (Previous & Final). Each academic year shall be of 12 months each. The entire course can thus be completed minimum in two years.

2. Course Curriculum

A. Curriculum Design

3. Delivery System

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

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7. Conduct of Examination

- (i) To be admitted to the examination for the Master of Arts (Sociology) examination a candidate must have.
 - (a) Completed the courses of study through Distance Learning Mode in this University prescribed for MA, examination.
 - (b) Registered with the University as a student.
- (ii) Each of the paper shall carry 100 marks. The distribution of marks shall be as follows:
 - (a) VVritten examination carrying 80 marks.
 - (b) Internal evaluation carrying 20 marks.
- (iii) The examination in each of the theory papers (written examination) shall be of Three hours duration.
- (iv) The students are required to appear at the University examination at the end of each academic session from the date notified by the University:
- (v) (a) A candidate having completed the course has to appear at the written extrainations & internal assessment. Assessment marks shall be awarded on the basis of class performance, attendance, seminar performance and overall behaviours.
 - (b) Three hour final examination carrying 80% of the total weight and Internal assessment carrying 20% of the total weight. To complete each Course the learner is required to secure minimum 45% of the 80 marks (36 marks) in the written examination and 45% of 20 marks (09 marks) in Internal assessment overall 45% in both written and Internal assessment taken together. Students securing 60% and above in aggregate will be placed in the First Class, those securing 45% and above but below 60% in aggregate will be placed in the Second Class.
 - (c) A candidate having completed the course to appear at the examination or fails to pass the examination or does not clear any paper shall be allowed to appear at the subsequent examination in only char/those part/s in which he/she has failed or absented himself/herself on the payment of prescribed examination fee without being required to go through the course again. However, this opportunity shall be given in only two more examinations within a period not exceeding three years excluding the main examination held at the end of tession. However, a candidate has to complete or pass the course within the maximum period of Five years from the date of admission.

- (d) There shall be provision of carry over the examination. The result of the final examination shall not be published till he/she appears and passes in the paper or has not completed for some reasons.
- (vi) The examination shall be conducted by the Magadh University which shall also finalize the date of examination, centre of examination and necessary fee for its conduct.
- [vii] In order to pass the Master of Arts (Sociology) examination, a candidate must obtain not less than 45 percent marks in Aggregate, otherwise the candidate shall be deemed to have falled.
- (viii) In order to pass the Master of Arts (Sociology) a candidate must have passed all the two years of examination separately.
- (ix) The name of successful candidates shall be arranged in order of meric as follows:
 - (a) Candidate who obtained 60 percent or more marks in final year shall be placed in First class.
 - (b) Candidate who obtained 45 percent or more but less than 60 percent marks shall be placed in the Second class.

8. Moderation of Results

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulation concerning moderation of examination results:

- (i) The candidate for the Master of Arts (Sociology) examination fail to secure first or second class by not more than 5 marks in the subject shall be awarded the marks required to enable him to secure first or second class as the case say be, and his result shall be declared accordingly.
- (ii) If a candidate for the Master of Arts (Sociology) examination passes in aggregate but fails to pass in any one subjects by not more than 5 percent marks or in any two subjects by not more than 3 percent marks in each subject, he/she shall be awarded the marks required to enable him/her to pass in the subject/subjects concerned and his/her result shall be declared accordingly.
- (iii) The provision for moderation of results shall not be applicable in case of Master of Arts (Sociology) Previous years of examination.



 Regulations and Ordinance for Admission to Master in Library & Information Science (M.LIS) under Magadh University, Bodh-Gaya.

REGULATION

1. Duration of Course

The duration of course (M.LIS programme) shall be of Two academic sessions of 9 months each.

2. Course Curriculum

Candidate for the Master's Degree in Library and Information Science Programme shall be examined in eight papers carrying 100 marks each divided into two Modules. There shall be six theoretical papers (written examination) and two practical-cum-project work with viva-voce examination.

For practical and viva-voce examination one external and one internal examiner will be called. The duration of written examination shall be of three hours each.

Module-I

- Application of Information Technology
- II Management of Library & Information Centre
- III Information Communication and Society
- IV Information Processing and Retrieval

Module-II

- V Specialized Information System
- VI Select any one (Optional Paper)
 - (a) Preservation and Conservation of Library Materials
 - (b) Technical Writing
 - (c) Research Methodology
 - (d) Public Library System & Services
- VII Information Technology (Practical)
- VIII Project & Viva-voce

3. Delivery System

The methodology of instruction in this programme shall be different from that of conventional courses. It will be more learner-oriented and the student would be an active participant in the teaching-learning process. Most of the instruction will be imparted through distance rather than face-to-face communication. The University will follow a multimedia approach for instruction, it comprises:

I. Printed Materials II. Audio-Visual Aids III. Counseling Session IV. Practical Training.

6. Medium of Instruction and Examination

- The final examination leading to the award of the degree shall be held at the end of the two academic session from the date notified by the University. (11)
- The mode of instruction shall comprise printed lessons in English, holding contact classes, evaluating response-sheets and using other audio-visual aids available. (111)
- Courses of study for Master in Library & Information Science examination shall be the same as prescribed by the Academic Council of the Magadh University. (IV)

7. Registration

Every student who is not already registered with Magadh University will have to get himself registered on payment of the requisite fee. The students, who are not registered under Magadh University, shall not appear at the examination.

8. Conduct of Examination

- To be admitted to the examination for the Master in Library & Information Science, a candidate must have:
 - (a) Completed the courses of study through Distance Education Mode in this University prescribed for M.LIS Examination.
 - (b) Registered with the University as a student.
- Each of the papers shall carry 100 marks. The distribution of marks shall be as follows: П.-
 - (a) Written examination carrying 80 marks; and
 - (b) Internal evaluation carrying 20 marks.
- The examination in each of the theory papers (written examination) shall be of Three hours 111
- The students are required to appear at the University examination at the end of each academic session from the date notified by the University. IV.
- They have to appear at the assessment examination in each academic session, carrying 20 marks in each subject. Assessment marks are awarded on the basis of overall ٧. performance.
- The students have to submit a project report before filling examination forms at the end of the second session. The project work shall be supervised by the teachers of the VI. department. The work based on field studies and site visits is to be undertaken by students as per decision of the departmental council.
- They have also to appear at the Practical examination of 100 marks (Paper-VII) besides project evaluation/viva voce examination of 100 marks(Paper-VIII). The Practical and viva-VII. voce examination shall be conducted by the external and internal examiners appointed by the University.
- A Candidate having completed the course has to appear at the written examinations, internal assessment, project-viva and Practical examination separately. VIII
 - A candidate having completed the course to appear at the examination or fails to pass the examination or does not clear any paper shall be allowed to appear at the subsequent examination in only that/those part/s and which he/she has failed or absented himself/herself on the payment of prescribed examination fee without being required to go through the course again. However, This opportunity shall be given in only two more examinations within a period not exceeding three years excluding the main examination held at the end of session.
 - There shall be provision of carry over the examination. The result of the final examination shall not be published till he/she appears and passes in the paper or has not completed for some reasons.
- The examination shall be conducted by the Magadh University which shall also finalise the date of examination, centre of examination and necessary fee for its conduct. IX.

- X. In order to pass the Master in Library & Information Science Examination, a candidate must obtain not less than 45 per cent marks in aggregate, otherwise the candidate shall be deemed to have falled.
- XI. In order to pass M.LIS final examination, a candidate must have passed M.LIS Module-1 and Module-2 examination separately.
- XII. The name of successful candidates shall be arranged in order of merit as follows:
 - (a) Candidate, who passes M.LIS Examination obtaining 75 per cent or more marks in any subject in all the six parts of the examination taken together, shall be declared to have passed with distinction in the subject.
 - (b) Candidate who obtained 60 per cent marks in aggregate or more shall be placed in
 - (c) Candidate who obtains 45 per cent or more but less than 60 per cent marks in aggregate shall be placed in the Second Class.

9. Moderation of Results

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulation concerning moderation of examination results:

- i) The candidate for the M.LIS Final examination fail to secure first or second class by not more than 5 marks in the subject shall be awarded the marks required to enable him to secure first or second class as the case say be, and his result shall be declared accordingly.
- It a candidate for the M.LIS Final examination passes in aggregate but falls to pass in any one subjects by not more than 5 per cent marks or in any two subjects by not more than 3 per cent marks in each subject, he/ she shall be awarded the marks required to enable him/her to pass in the subject/ subjects concerned and his/her result shall be declared accordingly.
- The provision for moderation of results shall not be applicable in case of M.LIS Module-I examination.

10. Publication of Results

- The list of successful candidates of the M.LIS final examination shall be published in order of merit.
- It a candidate has obtained distinction in any subject, it shall be mentioned against his name.

11. Award of Degree

Those who complete the programme successfully shall be awarded appropriate degree by Magadh University, Bodh-Gaya in prescribed form specifying the Class/Division in which he/she was placed.

ORDINANCE FOR ADMISSION

1. Admission and Selection Procedure

The University shall hold Entrance Test for selection of the candidates. The Test shall be conducted in accordance with certain procedures:

- (a) Application forms for Entrance Test shall be obtained at the office counter by depositing Rs. 500/- only through Demand Draft or may be obtained by sending a self-stamped registered envelope along with DD of Rs. 500/-.
- (b) Applications received shall be processed according to the requisite qualifications and conditions.
- (c) Final selection for admission shall be made strictly on the basis of Entrance Test.
- (d) The University reserves the right to take any decision in all matters of admission.

2. Reservation

Reservation of seats for admission shall be in accordance with the State Government's rules/Magadh University rules. In no case, the percentage of reservation fixed by the State Govt. will exceed.

3. Eligibility for Admission

To be admitted to the course for Master in Library & Information Science, a candidate must have passed the Bachelor of Library and Information Science of any recognized indian University or any examination recognized by the Academic Council of Magadh University as equivalent thereto.

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Graduate in any discipline with Diploma in Library and Information Science or two years of work experience in a recognized Library and Information Centre. Prference will be given to the candidates having work experience in a recognized Library and Information Centre and other related organizations.

- No student shall be admitted who, in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor, Magadh University, should not be admitted in the best interest of the University.
- No applicant shall be admitted who has not applied for the admission within notified time or who, on being selected for admission, does not get himself admitted within specified time, except where the delay has been condoned by the Vice-Chancellor.
- 4. Intake 150 (One hundred fifty) May be revised as per DEC guidelines.

5. Fee Structure

A candidate is required to pay the fee in two equal installments, Rs.5000/- at the time of admission and Rs.5000/- in second year. The course will run on self-finance basis, hence fee may be revised by the University, if necessary.
